Assistance for (Specific Populations)

Franklin County Department of Job & Family Services - Prevention Retention & Contingency (PRC) Program

(Applicant must live in Franklin County, have a household that contains a minor child or a woman in her 3rd trimester of pregnancy and meet the family income threshold of less than 165% of FPL)

- Financial assistance program to help low income families address an emergency or short-term need
- Applicants can receive assistance one-time in a 12 month period
- In response to COVID19 there is a temporary rental assistance program, PRC PLUS, for families with incomes between 166-300% FPL. All other PRC rules apply. This program is available 6/1/2020 12/15/2020

 - Must live in a CMHA owned and subsidized housing community
